TERILIZATION

IN GENERAL

Helps to control the population of dogs.

WHAT IS IT?

It is a surgery done by a veterinarian while the animal is under anaesthesia. During the surgery, the reproductive organs of a male or female dog are removed. After the surgery, the animal will never be able to reproduce again.

MALE


Benefits:


- Less aggressive;
- Less likely to escape (and get injured).

Benefits:

FEMALE

- Can't be in heat;
- Can't have puppies.





OTHER OPTIONS TO HELP CONTROL THE NUMBER OF DOGS

- All dogs in the community should be kept on a chain;
- All dogs should have a collar and wear the tag of the community to allow the identification of owned dogs and stray dogs;
- Control of the population of stray dogs.
